EXCELLENCE SCHOLARSHIP FAQ:

I. Modulo:

1. How accurate is the score given by Modulo?

 The system is under continuous development, so the score assigned may not be perfect. It is important to note that the final score will not be set by Modulo but by the scoring committees.

2. Can I upload more documents than Modulo allows?

- The HSZI office should be contacted, they can provide extra spaces, BUT no extra points will be awarded for more uploaded documents than the maximum score per category.

II. General:

1. Do I have to apply for the scholarship every six months?

- Yes, under the current system, you must apply every six months for both the Excellence and the Supplementary scholarships. Once the award is made, students who are successful will be paid retroactively each month.

2. Who can apply for the scholarship?

- Hungarian state-funded students are eligible for the supplementary scholarship (40.000Ft), Hungarian state-funded students and foreign students who are part of the Stipendium Hungaricum scheme are eligible for the excellence scholarships (60.000Ft 90.000Ft). Students who won an Excellence Scholarship in the previous semester may apply for the Excellence Scholarships in the following semester.
- Students who have won an ÚNKP in a given semester are NOT eligible to apply for the Excellence Scholarship in the given semester, but are still eligible for the additional scholarship (40.000Ft).

III. Scoring:

1. How are the scoring thresholds established?

- In the case of Excellence Grants, the scoring thresholds are established by the respective Doctoral Schools, and the scores are available and can be downloaded from the website of the Doctoral Institute (see here.) The scoring process is carried out by committees set up by the respective Doctoral School. Any questions regarding teaching, publications, certificates, etc. should be addressed to the respective Doctoral Schools, who will assess the points to be awarded according to the scoring system they have established.

2. Will the final result and the scoreboard be published?

-	The system is still being developed, but a public final score list without violating individual rights may be established in the future. It will also be published on the website of the Doctoral Institute.
