It is the greatest pleasure on behalf of the Local Committee to welcome the 69th meeting of SNTS in Szeged, the city of sunshine.

The University of Szeged is one of Hungary's most distinguished universities, and is among the most prominent higher education institutions in Central Europe. The predecessor to the modern university was the University of Kolozsvár (University of what is known today as Cluj-Napoca, Romania), founded in 1872 by Emperor Franz Joseph I, which, after the Treaty of Trianon in 1921, had to move to Hungary and was restarted in Szeged. In 1951, the Medical School was separated from the University and was established as an independent institution. In 1962, the University assumed the name of József Attila (JATE). And in 2000, the unification of the institutions under the name of University of Szeged (SZTE) took place.

From among its most prominent professors, Albert Szent-Györgyi, one of the founders of the Faculty of Science, must be mentioned. He received the Nobel Prize in Physiology or Medicine in 1937 for his discoveries in connection with Vitamin C.

Teaching at the University in Szeged started on 10 October, 1921. The new buildings constructed on the bank of the River Tisza between 1924 and 1930 housed primarily the clinics and the institutes of the Medical School. Other attractive buildings surrounding the new Cathedral were given to the Faculty of Sciences and to the College of Catholic Theology. The Faculties of Law and Arts were accommodated in older buildings, originally used for other purposes.

The Szeged International Biblical Conference was founded 1989. In the past 24 years, 3448 people have participated, 322 lectures have been given, and 141 foreign professors have given lectures which have been published in 19 volumes. The conference has also been the inspirer of the thought of translating the Jerome Bible Commentary into Hungarian.

As a result, we welcome all of you to the 69th General Meeting of SNTS in Szeged and wish all of you in the names of Bishop László Kiss-Rigó and the Rector of the University of Szeged, Gábor Szabó, an enjoyable stay in Szeged. We hope that it will be an enjoyable as well as a profitable visit for all of you.


