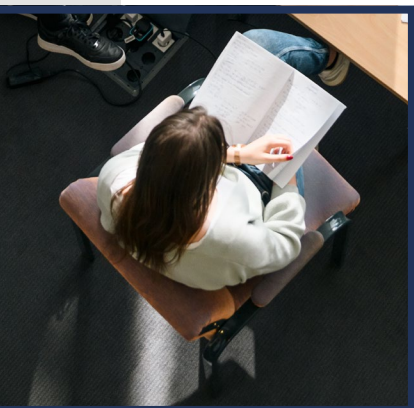
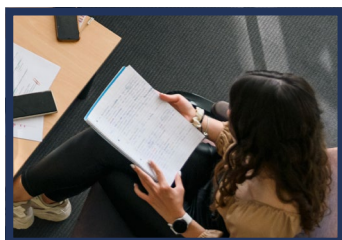

INTRODUCTION

The University of Szeged (SZTE) is a leading Hungarian university, committed to providing high-quality education across bachelor's and master's programs, doctoral training, higher education vocational programs, and postgraduate training. For years, it has consistently ranked among the top universities in Hungary in enrollment numbers, offering solid academic knowledge and degrees aligned with labor market needs to approximately 21,000 students, including more than 4,000 international students.

SZTE provides higher education across 13 fields of study. Its 12 faculties and its Teacher Training Center offer hundreds of bachelor's, master's, and doctoral programs, as well as higher education vocational training, postgraduate training, and adult education programs. These cover a wide range of disciplines, from health sciences, humanities, economics, law, and natural sciences to teacher training, agriculture, engineering, and the arts.

The University's academic and creative activities encompass both basic and applied research, artistic practices, and the development of products and services. In this context, the research conducted at the institution is of fundamental importance for the future of humanity.

All students, regardless of their form of study, are recognized as full members of the University and are entitled to use all its services. INFORMATION ON STUDIES

Academic year

The academic year is divided into two semesters, each consisting of a study period followed by an examination period. The academic year schedule – including the exact start and end dates, as well as holiday periods – is approved by the Senate of the University of Szeged, taking into account the opinion of the University's Student Union. The schedule is available on the University of Szeged's website and on the official University Bulletin Board. Faculties publish additional important information in their faculty calendars – including the dates of faculty events and the submission periods for dean's requests and credit transfer applications. Students are therefore advised to consult their faculty calendars regularly in addition to the University calendar. Further information on faculty calendars is provided in the faculty study guides.

Student ID card

Students can apply for a student ID card at SZTE's Student Services Office (HSZI). In addition to completing enrollment and signing the required agreements, they are required to have a registration record in the National Uniform Card System (NEK) that includes their photograph and signature. If this record is not available, it can be obtained in advance across the country at government offices that issue official documents.

Validation of the student ID card is conditional on the student having active status recorded in Neptun, the University's online academic administration system

Enrollment and Registration Procedure

Student status is established upon enrollment at the University. Enrollment is organized centrally for all students of the University of Szeged by the Student Services Office (HSZI) in cooperation with the Directorate for Academic Affairs, and it takes place at the Student Services Office. The purpose of centralized enrollment is to ensure that all administrative steps required to establish student status – such as data verification, contract signing, declarations, and other mandatory administrative procedures – can be completed as quickly as possible, in one place and at one time.

In the 2025/2026 academic year, enrollment will take place between August 28–30, 2025 (Thursday–Saturday), and September 1–4, 2025 (Monday–Thursday).

Final Examination Registration and Requirements

Students at SZTE register for their final examinations through Modulo, the University's electronic administration system. The scheduling of final examinations, as well as the verification of the requirements for obtaining the final certificate, is handled by the faculties. If the requirements are not met, or if the student so requests, the student's final examination registration will be cancelled, provided that this occurs before the start of the examination. ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS AND REGULATIONS

The Credit-Based System

The credit-based system is a modern method of organizing higher education that is widely applied across the world. A credit is a unit used to measure student workload. As a general rule, one semester of study – including contact hours and all other course-related work – corresponds to 30 credits. Accordingly, to obtain the final certificate, students must complete a total number of credits equal to thirty times the number of semesters specified in the program requirements.

The recommended curriculum is a semester-by-semester distribution of courses designed for students who wish to progress at an average pace. By adhering to this structure, students can meet all prerequisite requirements, complete approximately 30 credits per semester, and finish their studies within the standard duration specified in the program requirements. At the same time, **the credit-based system offers flexibility, allowing students to design their own study plan and – within certain limits – deviate from the recommended curriculum.** Enrolled students may register for courses totaling between 1 and 45 credits per semester, while maintaining active student status requires students to register for at least one program-specific course worth at least 1 credit per

semester. As a result, the total duration of studies may differ from the number of semesters outlined in the recommended curriculum.

For students who have previously studied at another higher education institution, it may be possible to have previously completed courses recognized through a **credit transfer procedure**, provided that such students can demonstrate – through appropriate documentation – that they have already fulfilled the requirements of the given course. The official procedure is described in Chapter 10 and Annex 3 of the Academic and Examination Regulations.

Descriptions of individual courses are available on Coospace, SZTE's online learning management system, where they are linked to the courses for which students are registered. Detailed course descriptions include the course title; the number of contact hours; the credit value; the course code; the prerequisites; the timetable; the names of the course coordinator and instructor; the course objectives; a description of the knowledge, skills, and competences to be acquired; the ongoing study requirements; the assessment methods and schedule; the available study materials; and the recommended reading.



Specific Conditions for State-Funded Study Programs

Students admitted under state-funded (full or partial scholarship) schemes are required, at the time of enrollment, to declare that they accept the conditions of state-funded study. They must also confirm that they have understood these conditions, which include the obligation to obtain their degree within one and a half times the standard duration of the program, and to maintain employment in Hungary for a period equivalent to the length of their state-funded studies within 20 years following graduation. This declaration is made by signing the enrollment form.

Fees and charges collected by SZTE

The annex to the regulations provides detailed information on **fees for student residence halls** across all types of programs. It also outlines students' **financial obligations**, the rules governing **reclassification** between state-funded and tuition-based study programs, and the **fees for physical education courses** offered by the University Sports Center. In addition, it includes provisions on **payment procedures for tuition and other charges**, as well as the conditions and assessment of externally funded academic scholarships.

Ad hoc and periodic student benefits are regulated separately in the Policy on Ad Hoc Student Benefits.

The SANSZ Office assists students with disabilities, including those with visual, hearing, or mobility impairments; speech impairments; specific learning difficulties (such as dyslexia, dysgraphia, or dyscalculia); attention or behavioral regulation difficulties; or autism spectrum disorder. Information for International Students

Like any student starting their studies abroad, international students who choose to study at the University of Szeged may face a range of practical challenges when arriving in Hungary. To support their preparation, the University's Office for International Cooperation and Admissions and the Directorate for International Affairs and Public Relations have compiled a detailed checklist covering key aspects such as travel arrangements, health insurance, and accommodation. If required, a visa must be obtained, and a residence permit may also be necessary for staying in Hungary. To apply for a residence permit, applicants must provide a passport-style photograph, a completed application form, proof of payment of the administrative fee, proof of tuition fee payment (for self-funded students), and proof of student status. For students beyond their first year, proof of academic progress is also required. Where applicable, a scholarship certificate must be submitted, which may also serve as proof of health insurance coverage. In addition, students in tuition-based programs may be required to demonstrate sufficient financial means, and proof of accommodation must also be provided.

Renewal of the residence permit requires students to present documents confirming their student status, accommodation, and financial situation. **The renewal process must be initiated no later than 30 days before the expiry of the residence permit, and all required documents must be submitted before the deadline.**

If the documents cannot be submitted on time, an extension may be requested; however, only one extension may be granted, and the total time allowed for completing the application may not exceed 45 days. The competent authority is required to make a decision within 70 days of the submission of the application. Any change of residence must also be reported. In many cases, personal appearance is required by law; therefore, the use of the electronic system does not exempt applicants from this obligation, and they must remain in Hungary during the procedure.
