The exhibition shares their stories of how Chinese art has become part of their lifestyle and offers a series of lectures and workshops to let you explore the philosophy behind these art forms. You will also be able to experience firsthand the beauty of Chinese characters and imagery created with ink and water on silk and xuan paper – and even create your own artwork.
