### **Creating Peace Through Music – Concert by Hiroko Minakami (piano) and Liu Wei (vocals)**

**Hiroko Minakami** and **Liu Wei** present a concert in Szeged as part of their 11-day European tour. The program features classical works (Brahms, Piazzolla, Smetana), original compositions, as well as Japanese, Mongolian, and Hungarian songs, all performed in their distinctive style. More than a simple concert tour, the series is built around the ideas of *intercultural understanding* and *a prayer for peace*.

**Hiroko Minakami (Mina)** is a Japanese pianist and composer. After graduating from the Musashino Academia Musicae, she continued her studies at the Moscow Conservatory and in Romania. She has performed in more than 3,000 concerts and has built a wide audience across the United States, Europe, and Asia. To date, she has released 14 CDs and has collaborated on an album with world-renowned jazz musician Ron Carter. She is a member of the International Committee of Artists for Peace (ICAP), led by acclaimed pianist Herbie Hancock.

**Liu Wei** is a vocalist, flutist, and master of throat singing from Inner Mongolia. He studied at the Shenyang Conservatory of Music in China and later at the Hyogo University of Teacher Education in Japan. He is a recognized practitioner of Mongolian *höömei* (throat singing) and is also highly regarded as a khuur flute player. He serves as president of several Japan–China and Mongolian cultural and music associations. He

has given more than 1,500 concerts in Japan and has received numerous awards, including the Grand Prize of the Asia Song Festival.

The concert is organized by the Huayu Cultural and Arts Association of Japan.
