*Requirements for the successful completion of the course:*

The lectures are public classroom lectures with personal presence. We will upload the slides of the lectures in PDF format on the CooSpace. (Scenes>Surgery II> Folders>Documents). Attending to the lectures is not mandatory according to the Faculty Code and regulations of the University.

At the end of each lecture the students can take a mini test about the material of the given lecture through the CooSpace. Writing the mini tests is not mandatory, however those students who achieve at least 80% of the maximum points from the mini tests, will receive an allowance, that we lower the limit of each grade of the mandatory test colloquium by 5 %.

In order to accept the mini tests results, students can miss only 2 of the tests overall during the semester. Proofs of the reason for absences –**not later than the week after the absence** – have to be scanned and presented to the official e-mail of the Secretariat of the Department of Surgery which is office.surg@med.u-szeged.hu. In the case of proven absence, the points of the missed test will not be counted in the final assessment. The unjustified absences will cause the mini-test results 0 point for each question.

The lack of internet connection, or bad connection should be indicated when writing the mini tests to the supervisor surgeon who can give the student a stamped paper, to be able to finish the test. Students **have to send the proof of the bad connection right away after the lecture** to the official e-mail address of the secretariat (office.surg@med.u-szeged.hu, **or else we cannot accept the paper test results.**

**The semester's final exam** is a mandatory written exam with **50 questions** that takes place in the TIK Computer Cabinet at the announced time. During the exam, to answer questions students have one minute for each.

We pointedly call the attention on the fact **the test is based both of the lectures** and the relevant chapters of the **official textbook.**

**Evaluation:** passed (2) over 60-69,9%, accepted (3) over 70-79,9%, good (4) over 80-89,9%, excellent (5) above 90%.

Writing the test is obligatory. Failed test examination is also retaken in the form of a written exam. An oral examination (according to the previously announced topic list) can be taken only after the failed second written exam. Without participation at two written exams students cannot take the oral exam.

The form of practice is blockpractice, maximum of 28 hours from the 12th to the 14th week of education period. The students spend their practice in either in the educational hospitals surgery unit, or in the Surgery Clinic's different unit. Attending to the practice is mandatory. If the student has more absences of the practice than it is allowed, they have to make it up by the end of the semester according to the Faculty Code and Regulations. The requirements to accept the practice are the signed and stamped attendance sheets.
